To carry the mission forward into the next fifty years, our Board of Directors and leadership team work each year on a five-year strategic vision grounded in our core principles and values. This plan reflects our commitment to remaining faithful to our mission while casting a vision for the years to come.

Our Strategic Plan is a four-page, principle-based document that affirms our convictions and outlines our ideal future. The attached **Operational Plan 2025–26** details how that vision is being lived out through specific, one-year objectives. As with last year, we made no changes to the wording of the **Strategic Plan 2025–30**, which remains identical to the Strategic Plan 2024–29. The Operational Plan is updated annually, so be sure to review the latest version to see dozens of new initiatives.

I'd like to highlight one key initiative for this year: the continuation of our ACSI accreditation renewal. Our last renewal occurred in March 2020. ACSI (the Association of Christian Schools International) is the largest evangelical accreditation association in North America. Alongside our regional accreditation through WASC, the ACSI renewal represents a valuable opportunity to improve our school. Our association with like-minded, faithful schools strengthens us.

We were honored to be invited to apply for ACSI's inaugural Exemplary Status—an invitation extended to only 18 other ACSI schools nationwide. We are already working on the application and will host the ACSI team in March 2026.

So, hold on to your hats as we embrace a fantastic 48th year and prepare for the celebration to come!
